

STUDENT SAFETY

For the safety of everyone in the building, our exterior doors are locked during instructional time (time in which children are in class). Doors will be open during morning, recess and lunch to enable students access to the building, but will be locked after they enter. The main entrance will remain unlocked throughout the day and, as always, visitors will be required to report into the office when visiting the school.

It is important for parents, caregivers, etc. to advise the school of any special medical information or concerns their child has (medication, etc.).



School District Bussing

Notes to All Parents Regarding Bussing:

- i. Students <u>must be</u> registered for transportation and prior to taking a school bus. EVEN IF THEY WERE REGISTERED LAST YEAR, THEY MUST BE REGISTERED AGAIN THIS YEAR. Bussing students must present a bus pass each time they board and depart the bus. Registration is only available online.
 - o Students taking the bus one or more days a week MUST be registered with Transportation Department (and have a pass).
 - o Courtesy riders (ie birthday party, daycare changes, etc.) MUST present a note signed by their guardians to their school office and request a *Courtesy Bus Pass*. Students will not be allowed on the bus without this. *This should not be a regular occurance*.
- ii. They are to use only their assigned bus and regular bus stop, unless they are a courtesy rider with the necessary documentation.
- iii. It is the responsibility of the parents or guardians to check bus pick up and drop off times in August prior to the new school year. The information can be found under the transportation tab on the Kootenay-Columbia School District's website (Castlegar area: http://www.sd20.bc.ca/bus-schedule/articles/bus-schedule.html / Trail area: http://www.sd20.bc.ca/trail-area-bus-schedule---morning-runs.html) or check with your school.
- iv. After school, all K-12 students will be dropped at their scheduled stop. It is the responsibility of the parent/guardian to meet their children at the bus stop if they feel it is necessary. If you do not want your child to walk home alone, please be at the stop 5 minutes ahead of drop off time to ensure the connection and to avoid having your child standing alone at the stop.
- v. Children should know their bus route numbers. It is also a good idea for your child to know your phone number and address.
- vi. In the morning, students should be at their bus stop 5 minutes ahead of the scheduled departure time. Buses do not wait for tardy students.
- vii. Under no circumstances should children run to catch the bus.
- viii. Provide the necessary safety precautions for your children when going to and from the bus stop.
- ix. Make certain that your children are properly dressed, in case of emergencies during cold or wet weather.
- x. Accept responsibility for the proper conduct of your children before boarding a bus, during the daily trips and upon discharge.
- xi. Parents will be responsible for any damage to a bus by their children.
- xii. Encourage children to obey all traffic rules and school bus regulations.
- **xiii.** Children are expected to proceed directly from the bus stop to their destination.
- xiv. For your child's safety, a video surveillance system which includes audio recording may be installed on the school bus.

Student Conduct

STUDENTS MUST:

- a) Follow the driver's directions the FIRST time they are given.
- b) Keep their hands, feet and objects to themselves.
- c) Stay in their seat unless directed to do otherwise.
- d) Talk quietly, using only appropriate language.
- e) Be at the bus stop 5 minutes before scheduled leave time.
- f) Not eat or drink on the bus.
- g) Not bully or intimidate others.
- h) Not smoke, vape, take drugs or alcohol on the bus and/or at the bus stop.

A student whose behavior contravenes these values or whose actions distract the driver; cause to have the potential to cause harm or discomfort to self or others, is subject to disciplinary action, which may include the following:

- ${\bf 1.}\ {\bf Verbal\ warning\ from\ the\ bus\ driver\ (initially\ in\ routine\ situations)}.$
- 2. Issue of a School Bus Incident Report:
- a) Written warning.
- b) Suspension of bus privileges.

Some examples of actions that could result in suspension for an undetermined length of time are as follows: issued for repeated offences or for striking another person; fighting; vandalism; spitting; throwing objects out bus windows; lighting matches or other flammable objects; possession/use of laser pointer; possession/use of weapons; unauthorized use of emergency equipment; unauthorized exit through rear emergency door; and other serious contraventions of the bus rules.
